



- In harmony with the agent



John Murray on Scripture

"The inescapable fact is that, for our Lord, the Scripture, just because it was *Scripture*, just because it fell within the denotation of the formula 'it is written,' was a finality [Christ's] attitude is one of meticulous acceptance and reverence. ...The only explanation of such an attitude is what Scripture said, God said."

The Infallibility of Scripture

Trustworthy

- John 10:35 Jesus answered them, "Isn't it written in your law, I said, you are gods? If he called those to whom the word of God came 'gods'—and the Scripture cannot be broken— do you say, 'You are blaspheming' to the one the Father set apart and sent into the world, because I said: I am the Son of God?"
- Numbers 23:19 "God is not a man, that he might lie, or a son of man, that he might change his mind. Does he speak and not act, or promise and not fulfill?"

Inerrancy of Scripture

- 1. God, who is Himself Truth and speaks truth only, has inspired Holy Scripture in order thereby to reveal Himself to lost mankind through Jesus Christ as Creator and Lord, Redeemer and Judge. Holy Scripture is God's witness to Himself.
- 2. Holy Scripture, being God's own Word, written by men prepared and superintended by His Spirit, is of infallible divine authority in all matters upon which it touches: it is to be believed, as God's instruction, in all that it affirms: obeyed, as God's command, in all that it requires; embraced, as God's pledge, in all that it promises.
- 3. The Holy Spirit, Scripture's divine Author, both authenticates it to us by His inward witness and opens our minds to understand its meaning.



Inerrancy of Scripture

- 4. Being wholly and verbally God-given, Scripture is without error or fault in all its teaching, no less in what it states about God's acts in creation, about the events of world history, and about its own literary origins under God, than in its witness to God's saving grace in individual lives.
- 5. The authority of Scripture is inescapably impaired if this total divine inerrancy is in any way limited or disregarded, or made relative to a view of truth contrary to the Bible's own; and such lapses bring serious loss to both the individual and the Church.



What Inerrancy ISN'T

Linguistic qualifications:

- No use of nonliteral forms of speech
- No use of phenomenological language
- Absolute precision of description
- Strict "court transcript" style reporting of the words of speakers
- Conformity to linguistic conventions




What Inerrancy ISN'T

Other qualifications - biblical inerrancy does not imply:

- Exhaustive information (cf. Deut. 29:29; John 20:30; 21:25).
- Inerrancy of all opinions held by biblical writers but not inscripturated
- No differences in perspective or emphasis
- Strict chronological order in all historical accounts
- Divine Dictation
- The perfection of any or all copies of the original biblical texts






The Extent of Scripture
